

The Top End region encompasses, the Tiwi Islands, West Daly and West Arnhem.

Tourism is a significant driver in the region, with world renowned attractions like Litchfield and Kakadu National Parks. Other industries include horticulture, forestry and mining. Its natural assets and infrastructure help create an enviable lifestyle for residents and a must-see destination for tourists and visitors.

## Future of Jabiru and Kakadu

The NT Government has committed \$135.5M to the future of Jabiru as it transitions from a mining town to a tourism and regional services hub. This includes a new health clinic, education precinct, Bininj Resource Centre, Government Services Hub, power station and a five-year service delivery guarantee.

## Wadeye Government Business Centre

The NT Government is working with the Kardu Diminin Corporation Board and Kardu Alliance members on the development of the Government Business Centre in Wadeye to ensure an increased, permanent and reliable government presence in the region.

This purpose-built building will be Aboriginal owned with the government committing to a long-term lease to ensure the financial viability for the owners.

## Wadeye and Wurrumiyanga Child and Family Centres

Two new purpose built Child and Family Centres will be delivered in partnership with local communities, in Wadeye and Wurrumiyanga. The centres will deliver vital support services to children, young people and their families.

## Top End road upgrades

The NT Government has developed a road strategy which includes a program of works for upgrades to the Kakadu Road, Adelaide River to Wadeye Road corridor, Adelaide River Flood Plain and Arnhem Highway, Litchfield Park Road and Tiwi Island roads.

## Mandorah Jetty

The design of a new jetty and marine facilities for Mandorah is currently underway. The new facility will improve safety for ferry passengers and enable the service to grow to meet increased demand.



## Remote Housing Investment Package implementation

Work is well underway in major communities across the Top End to build new housing and additional living spaces in existing homes as part of the HomeBuild NT and Room to Breathe remote housing initiatives.

## Recreational fishing infrastructure upgrades

The NT Government is delivering enhanced recreational fishing infrastructure such as upgraded boat ramp facilities, artificial reefs and fishing platforms at Shady Camp and Dundee.

## Arts Trail Infrastructure, Injalak Arts in Gunbalanya

Injalak Arts will have additional infrastructure completed by December 2020 as part of the Arts Trail Gallery Extension Program to deliver targeted gallery infrastructure and innovative facilities in the Territory.

## Litchfield National Park Ugrades

The Litchfield Central Valley development will open up new camping and swimming spots across the national park and offer more campgrounds, picnic areas, car parking, walking tracks and viewing platforms. It will also include the sealing of 18 kilometres of unsealed road and 4WD tracks to improve accessibility.

## New Police Complex at Maningrida

Land for a new police complex in Maningrida, with additional housing, has been secured and construction is set to get underway in 2021. The police station will support an increased level of proactive policing in the district to prevent crime and boost community safety. The new facility will have the ability to accommodate an increase in the number of police officers in Maningrida.
